David's introduction to the sport of purebred dogs began in 1982 with the purchase of his first Whippet, that summer his family attended a Whippet race meet. IT WAS THRILLING!

David loved the athleticism of the dogs and the excitement of the races. It was incredible watching the whippets perform the job they were breed to do. In conjunction with the race meet a fun match was held and he was encouraged to show his Whippet in the match. Being a complete novice, he hadn't a clue how to show a dog. After a crash course in handling, he ventured into the ring and won Best in Match. He was hooked!

In the years that followed Dashing Whippets began. Together with his wife, Gina, they have had great success with the ancestors of their first Whippet. Their

Whippets compete in the show ring; at lure coursing and racing field trials and most importantly they have also proven themselves as producers. Having the good fortune of having the top producing Whippet dam in the country for the year 2000.

In recent years we have had the pleasure of a wonderful friendship with Debbie Butt and Amanda Giles of Sporting Fields. Debbie and Amanda have graciously shared many of their finest Whippets with us and we are truly grateful. This partnership has resulted in five individual Best in Show winners, a National Specialty Best of Breed winner, the number one Whippet female for 2018 and National Specialty BOS winner. As well as the top producing bitch of the decade (2010-2020). Additionally, we share an interest in Border Collies and the Berger Picard.

Thank you for inviting me to judge at this very auspicious Whippet National Show – I am very much looking forward to this appointment. My Dog Life started firstly with English Cocker Spaniels as a young girl– my first showing female retired on two challenges. The competition was fierce and we competed at our very best, considering the inexperience that we had. I continued to show and breed Cocker Spaniels, and then went forward to gain my Gundog Judging Licence. My interest in different breeds was tempted from Judging, and I am always grateful to my mentors that fuel the fire and enthusiasm to continue to learn and understand. In the 1990's I ventured into Whippets, the breed I currently own, and have been fortunate to have been started with a solid and generous foundation in the breed with dogs from the very successful

Taejaan Whippets from Molly Rule-Steele. I have successfully shown my Whippets to Champions and last year bred my first Whippet litter under my prefix Beaulorien My love of the breed has also found myself as Secretary of the Whippet Association of Victoria and each September the Club run's the two largest Whippet Shows in Australia. In , August 2022, I finally reached my All Breeds Judging Status. I have judged extensively throughout Australia, and in New Zealand, South Africa and the United Kingdom.

ALL Entries **MUST** be received by closing date: WEDNESDAY, July 3rd, 2024 @ 9:00pm Pacific Time

The tendering of NSF cheque shall be considered non-payment of entry fees and is punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards. A collection fee of \$25.00 will be added to the amount of any returned cheque. Exhibitors whose charges are declined by the Bank Card Authorization Department will be assessed a service charge of \$25.00 for each transaction declined. Telephone entries are not accepted by the Show Secretary. Incomplete entries or entries received without fees, or entries received after the advertised closing date will not be accepted.

Attention foreign exhibitors, please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian Funds. If you sent a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please DO NOT make cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian Funds.

CONFORMATION CLASSES

The following Regular CKC Classes (divided by sex) will be offered:

JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 6 months of age and under 9 months of age on the day of the show

SENIOR PUPPY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog 9 months of age and under 12 months of age on the day of the show

12 to 18 MONTHS - This class shall be for any dog 12 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show

CANADIAN BRED CLASS - This class shall be for any dog born in Canada

BRED BY EXHIBITOR CLASS - This class shall be for any dog owned and handled in the ring by owner/breeder. The handler MUST be the owner/co- owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog at the class level, but need not handle the dog for further awards

OPEN - This class shall be for all dogs

VETERANS CLASS - This class shall be for dogs 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in these classes may be spayed or neutered. This class will be divided into 7 years and under 10 years, 10 years and 12 years, 12 years and older. The winner of each class in each sex will compete for Best of Breed.

COURSING (FIELD DOG) CLASS – This class shall be for any dog with CKC lure coursing points, divided by sex. Spayed and Neutered dogs may compete. Judged prior to Best of Breed judging and the winners in each sex will compete for Best of Breed.

SPECIALS ONLY CLASS - This class shall be for any dog that has a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and has attained the required points for Championship status. Note: A Listed dog may be moved to the Specials Only Class after the closing of entries, provided the CKC Individual or Event Registration Number was received prior to the first day of the show. The request to move a class dog to the Specials Only Class MUST be received by the Show Secretary ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THE OPENING OF THE SHOW ON THE DAY CONCERNED. TCN Fees WILL NOT be refunded.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES

Dogs entered in the Non-regular classes must also be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only except for Stud Dog and Brood Bitch whose progeny MUST be entered in a regular class.

EXHIBITION ONLY - All dogs entered in this class shall be listed in the catalogue with the same particulars as dogs entered in regular competition. Dogs entered in this class MAY NOT COMPETE in any Regular class but may enter and compete in Non-Regular classes and/or Parades ONLY

BABY PUPPY - This class is for dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show

STUD DOG/BROOD BITCH - This class is for a stud dog/brood bitch and two or more of his/her get.

BRACE - This class shall be for two dogs of the same breed handled by one person on one lead.

RACING CLASS - This class of for any dog with CWA, NAWRA, WRA or NOTRA racing championship points. Males/Females will be judged together in one class following the other Non-Regular classes and Altered.

SEXUALLY ALTERED CLASSES

Eligibility for the Altered classes shall be limited to dogs over six months of age, which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points MAY NOT be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered class judging. This class WILL be judged upon the completion of Best of Breed. Two classes ONLY will be offered:

ALTERED MALE AND ALTERED FEMALE

Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each sex will be declared Winners and the second place winner from each sex will be awarded Reserve. The Altered Winners Male and Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best Altered in Breed.

Juvenile Sweepstakes

Judge: Robynne Spencer

Juvenile Sweepstakes is to all puppies four months and under eighteen months of age regardless of place of birth. All dogs must be entered in one of the regular official classes (or Baby Puppy) on the same day. Dogs will be judged in one of the following eight classes (divided by sex):

Baby Puppy - 4 months and under 6 months Junior Puppy - 6 months and under 9 months Senior Puppy - 9 months and under 12 months Juvenile Puppy - 12 months and under 18 months

For final judging the first place puppy from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 15% of total fees collected for the Juvenile Sweepstakes Best Of Opposite in Sweepstakes - rosette & 10% of total fees collected for Juvenile Sweepstakes 1st in each class - rosette & 50% of the class fees collected for that specific class 2nd to 4th in each class - rosette 25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

Veteran Sweepstakes

Judge: Robynne Spencer

Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all dogs 7 years of age and over and entered in a regular class or for exhibition only on the same day. Spayed and neutered dogs may compete provided they are also entered in a regular class or exhibition only.

Dogs to be judged in one of the following six classes (divided by sex):

7 years and under 10 years 10 years and under 12 years 12 years and older

For final judging the first place winner from each of the classes will be brought together for the final judging of Best in Veteran Sweepstakes.

Best in Sweepstakes - rosette & 15% of total fees collected for the Veteran Sweepstakes Best Of Opposite in Sweepstakes - rosette & 10% of total fees collected for Veteran Sweepstakes

1st in each class - rosette & 50% of the class fees collected for that specific class 2nd to 4th in each class - rosette 25% of fees collected will be retained by the club to defray costs

JUNIOR HANDLING

National Only - Saturday, July 27th, 2024 following Sweepstakes (before Conformation)

Judge: Robynne Spencer

Entries will be accepted at the show secretary's desk in the morning.

Entry Fee: free

Competition is open to all Junior Handlers between the ages of 4 and up to 18 years of age (of the competition year). Pee Wees do not compete for best overall. Dogs handled by the juniors must be entered in a Regular Conformation class or in Exhibition Only on Saturday, July 27th, 2024. Dogs do not need to be owned by the junior.

Junior Conformation Classes:

Pee Wee (non-competitive) - 4 to 6 years Junior Novice - 7 to 10 years Junior Open - 7 to 10 years Intermediate Novice - 11 to 14 years Intermediate Open - 11 to 14 years Senior Novice - 15 to 18 years Senior Open - 15 to 18 years

If a handler achieves six first place wins, he must move to the Open Class within his age group.

Pee Wees - ribbon Best Overall Handler - large rosette & prize Runner Up - rosette and prize 1st in each class - ribbon & prize 2nd thru 4th - ribbon

Please note that effective January 1, 2016, in accordance with Section 3.4.1 of the Junior Handling Rules & Regulations, Junior Handlers will be required to apply to CKC Head Office for a **Junior Handling Number**. Section 3.4.1 "Junior Handler with the exception of Pee Wees, must apply to CKC Head Office on the appropriate form for a Junior Handling Number within 30 days of competing in their first Junior Handling event. This Junior Handling Number will be used by the Junior Handler for the duration of their Junior Handling career. If a Junior Handling number is not obtained, Junior Handling points earned will not be tracked."

CAMPING AND RV PARKING

The Park will allow limited overnight camping on the grounds. Dry camping, self-contained units only no water or electric hookups, with a maximum of 20 RV's parked on site. Due to potential fire restrictions, RV's will be required to remain parked for their stay, no coming and going, unless tow vehicle is parked in the gravel parking lot. More restrictions and the use of generators and BBQs may also be imposed if fire danger is high.

Tenters can camp on the grass but vehicle must be parked in the gravel parking lot.

RV fees: \$100 for 3 nights (Thursday, Friday, Saturday) or \$40 per night. Tenters: \$20 per night.

No overnight camping permitted on Sunday. All overnight camping MUST be pre-registered.

GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available online at <u>www.ckc.ca</u>

1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.

2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.

3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.

4. A Judge or any person participating in any capacity at a Dog Show held under CKC Rules shall not be subjected to any indignity of any kind during the progress of the show and it shall be the duty and obligation of the Club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out. The Show Superintendent shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of the rules, and the Discipline Committee shall have the power to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this rule has been violated.

5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.

6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are Pacific Time.

7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.

8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$115 plus GST (for Canadian residents) (\$230 non-resident), which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.

9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.

10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.

11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.

12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

ADDITIONAL CLUB RULES:

Exhibitors will be responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Violators will be asked to leave the show grounds.

Dogs are not allowed in washrooms and must be on leash at all times on the show grounds.

The welfare of an exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that you will exercise control and restraint over the children in your care on the days of these shows.

The Club is not responsible for lost or stolen property from exhibitors or venders/concessions.

The Club will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune to either dogs, exhibitors, spectators or vendors.

You must leave your setup in the same clean condition you found it in when you first arrived at the show.

Any videographer or photographer, other than the official videographer/photographer, that is going to take pictures/videos, for which they will be paid, will require written permission from Whippet Club of BC and the official show videographer/photographer.

AGREEMENT

I (we) acknowledge that I (we), all exhibitors, handlers and patrons, know and abide by the "CKC Dog Show Rules", and that I am (we are) familiar with their content. I (we) agree that the Club holding this show has the right to refuse this entry for cause, which the Club shall deem to be sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of the Show and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons or trophies, I (we) agree to hold National Whippet Club of Canada, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or show secretary and the owner or lessor of the premises and any employees of the aforementioned parties, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of a dog while in or upon the show premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim, and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss of a dog by disappearance, theft, death or otherwise, and from any claim for damage or injury to the dog, whether such loss, disappearance, theft, damage or injury be caused or alleged to be caused by the negligence of the Club or any of the parties aforementioned, or by the negligence of any other person, or any other cause or causes.

I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting therefrom, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves), or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this show, howsoever such injuries, death or damage to property may be caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or not the same may have been caused and whether or any of their employees or agents, or any other person.

CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points Allocated*	0	1	2	3	4	5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed here under.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC Event Registration Number (ERN) and have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level.

In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain a minimum of 20 points which must include a minimum of two wins of at least 2 points and at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 **Grand Champion Bronze (GChB)** The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points,

which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 **Grand Champion Silver (GChS)** The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points,

which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 **Grand Champion Gold: (GChG)** The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) (48-06-12)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
