ENTRY LIMIT: These Trials are limited. If the tests fill, waiting lists will be kept and dogs from the waiting list may be entered and added.

Handlers may only handle 1 dog in each component at each level. Dogs can only be entered in Open through Masters if they have already obtained the preceding level title.

MOVE UPS: Same day trial move-ups will not be allowed. Move-ups for the Sunday trial are permitted. Please submit by the end of the first trial day.

JUDGING SCHEDULES: sent by email to exhibitors after the closing date

EQUIPMENT: The dog may wear a buckle, snap or martingale collar and/or body harness in the ring. Collars/harnesses with tags may be worn in the ring. Harnesses may have the leash attached to the front clip or on the back. Electronic training and pinch collars are not allowed on the grounds.

PENALTIES ISSUED BY THE CLUB: Dropping food while rewarding is considered contamination. Contamination of the search area, at the discretion of the Judge may result in a non-qualifying score. Any dog that urinates or defecates or vomits within the search area will be excused from the class and will result in a non-qualifying score.

SCENT DETECTION RULEBOOK: It is up to the individual handler to review the CKC Scent Detection Rulebook of most recent (January 1st, 2024).

REMINDER: That anyone discussing hides before the end of the trial will be excused and asked to leave as per CKC rules. Please show consideration for other competitors.

BITCHES IN SEASON: Bitches in season shall be eligible to enter the test but will run last in each component.

ADDITIONAL TRIAL AND VENUE INFORMATION:

1. The club reserves the right to remove any person from the trial. The Event Chairperson shall have full control of the trial, which will be governed by CKC rules.
2. Any dog excused by the chairperson or veterinarian for any reason, shall not, after being excused compete in any class for any award for the balance of the trial.
3. The Trial Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability for, either dogs, exhibitors or patrons in the event of an accident or misfortune.
4. The owner of a dog entered in these trials is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
5. If, because of civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the club, it is impossible to open or complete the trials, there is no refund of entry.

6. It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, ring steward, volunteer or competitor at an obedience or rally trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Event Chairperson shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
8. Please allow for absentees and variances in the rate of judging.
9. Please Obey ENTER and EXIT gates in the trial area.
10. No dogs and equipment shall not be left unattended at the trial venue.
11. Dogs must be on leash at all times inside the trial venue and trial grounds.
12. Exhibitors will be required to crate their dogs in their vehicle. Please be prepared for all types of weather.
13. Spectators are permitted but only in designated areas no outside food sources will be allowed in spectator area - as per CKC Rules Spectators are encouraged to photo and video dogs and handlers while they search, however under no circumstances may they share this with any handler competing in the same class who has not yet run. Handlers are not allowed to take video while handling a dog. These videos are for the enjoyment of those who cannot be present to watch the team search, and for the handler to have a keepsake of their experience.
14. Access to trial parking will be allowed on Saturday, August 15th, 2026, starting at 7:00 am. Please follow posted signage. Please Park neatly. Please adhere to Fire Lanes in all areas around the venue.
15. Exhibitors are expected to maintain a clean area. Please be considerate when utilizing any facilities. No dogs are permitted in the washrooms.
16. Exhibitors and Participants are expected to follow these event guidelines. Failure to comply may result in excusal from the remainder of this event. The club reserves the right to remove any person(s) from the show and the venue, which are governed by CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB (CKC) rules.

Booking Regulations and Policies

- At least one person in the group must be 19 years of age or older.
- Maximum six people per RV stall, including children.

Facilities and On-site Rules

- **No dumping station on-site** – please plan to use an approved RV dump elsewhere.
- **No garbage or recycling** – pack out everything you pack in. The Big White Transfer Station is open 9:30am - 5:30pm Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
- **No motorized recreational vehicles** (ATVs, dirt bikes, etc.). Vehicles must remain within the parking lot.
- **Pets must be on a leash** and under control at all times.
- **No alcohol** consumption in public areas such as hiking trails or resort common spaces (in line with BC regulations).

Washrooms:

- Happy Valley outdoor washroom facility
- Open Thursday–Sunday only and cleaned regularly on those days.

Safety, Environment and Wildlife

- No smoking anywhere in the alpine, on hiking trails, or on chairlifts due to high forest fire risk.
- Stay on designated trails to protect the fragile mountain ecosystem; do not pick wildflowers.
- Do not feed wildlife or leave food or food waste outside – it can attract bears and other animals.

Bear awareness:

- Store food, garbage, and cooking gear securely inside your RV.
- Never approach or feed bears.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER

Mountain weather can change quickly

Recommended items:

- ✓ Light jacket
- ✓ Rain shell
- ✓ Sunglasses
- ✓ Sunscreen
- ✓ Hat
- ✓ Layers for cooler evenings

The resort is 5500 ft in elevation and is typically 10 degrees cooler than Kelowna during the day. Daytime temperatures are often warm, while mornings and evenings can be considerably cooler.

Helpful Tips for First-Time Visitors

- ✓ Book accommodation early
- ✓ Reserve bike rentals and lessons in advance
- ✓ Bring layers for changing weather
- ✓ Arrive early for activities and lift access
- ✓ Check daily operating hours before heading out
- ✓ Stay hydrated at higher elevations
- ✓ Take time to enjoy the incredible mountain views

BEAR SAFETY

Avoiding Bear Encounters

Surprising a bear or encountering a food-conditioned bear should be avoided. Here are some tips to reduce the chances of this happening:

- Watch for bear signs like scat, tracks, freshly overturned logs, fresh claw marks on trees.
- Talk or sing to avoid surprising a bear. Be cautious around running water, thick brush or high wind that may mask your presence. Bear bells are not recommended as the high-pitched tinkle does not travel as far and is not recognized as a human.
- Be aware of your surroundings and do not use headphones when hiking, biking or running in bear country.
- Manage your attractants and never put someone else at risk by leaving organics behind. Pack out what you pack in. Tossing organics (apple cores and banana peels) can attract wildlife to a roadside which may result in a vehicle collision.
- Avoid hiking alone. Travelling with another person results in more noise and may also help dissuade a bear from approaching.
- Keep pets leashed or under control when in bear country. In a review of black bear attacks, dogs were involved in over 50% of black bear inflicted injuries on humans*. Dogs may be perceived as a potential threat or prey.
- Use extra caution in bear habitat and where sightlines are poor. This includes berry bushes with ripe fruit, salmon-bearing streams and other areas bears are known to frequent.
- If you find a carcass leave the area immediately and notify the Conservation Officer Service and/or landowner.
- Take training such as a Wildlife Awareness and Safety Course offered by WildSafeBC that shows the "Staying Safe in Bear Country" video. A summary of the video content is available [here](#).
- Carry bear spray and be able to access it quickly. Do not carry it in your pack or attached to your bike.
